When you are baptized you make a covenant with Heavenly Father. This covenant consists of promises made by both you and Heavenly Father.

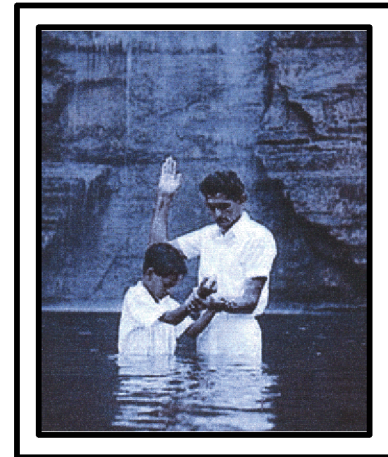
Promise:
