
Elder \_\_\_\_\_ taught of the importance of turning to Christ:


Elder Ballard spoke of the impressive things a hive of bees working together can accomplish. Follow each bee's path to match each Apostle with his message.

Elder \_\_\_\_\_ spoke of our discipleship:



President \_\_\_\_\_ taught of Christ's power to save:


"Jesus Christ is the light and the life of the world. As we fix our gaze upon His teachings, we will be guided to the harbor of spiritual safety."



Elder \_\_\_\_\_taught on becoming a true Christian:
