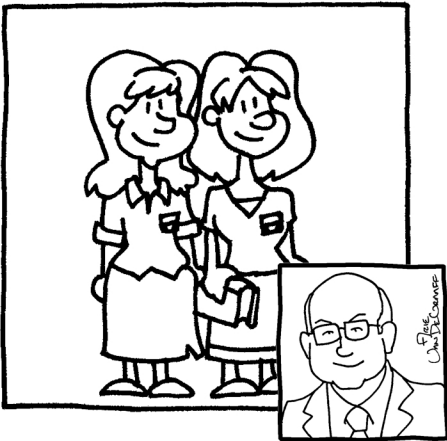

Elder _____ said of missionary work:

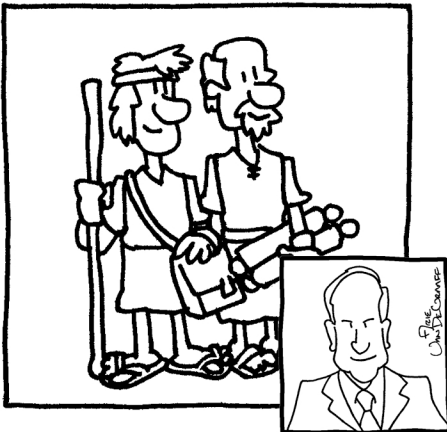

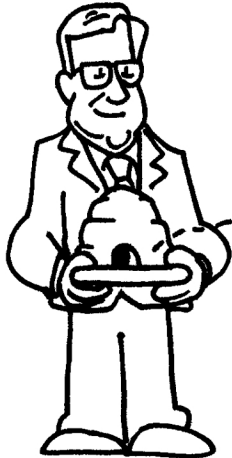

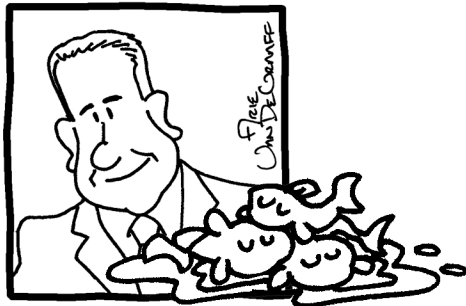
Elder _____ spoke of children:

Elder Holland shared a story where the Apostle Peter when "a fishing." Count the number of fish next to each Apostle to match the Apostles' messages.

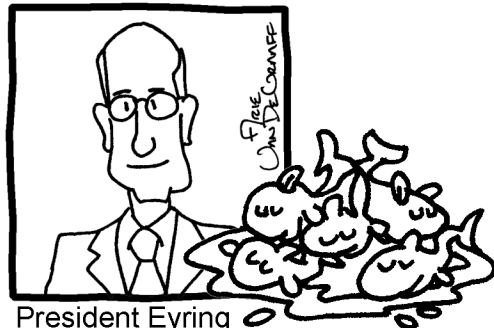


President Monson

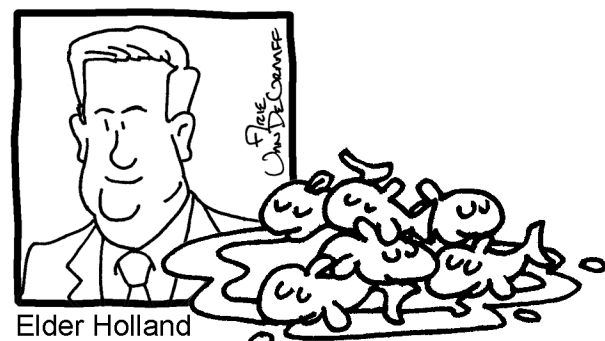

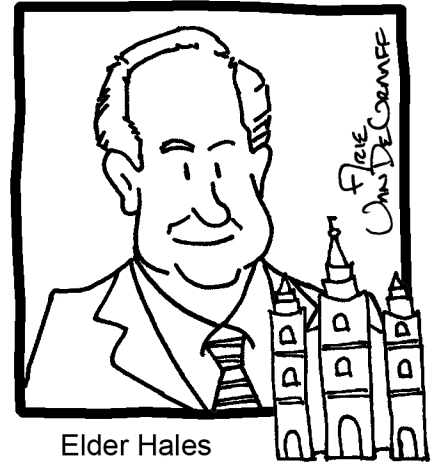
Elder Scott emphasized the importance of temple and family history work. Match each temple with its silhouette, to find out on what topic each Apostle spoke.
